Goals for Agricultural Curriculum

As the dialogue about high school agricultural education curriculum increases, I find myself again looking for perspective from my "A Handbook on Teaching Vocational Agriculture" by Glen Charles Cook in 1938 textbook.

Here is a sampling about curriculum from the textbook.

- "Some underlying principles to consider... 1. To develop student abilities to make an intelligent choice of their farming programs which will later help them in becoming more established in farming."
- "5. To develop student abilities which will enable him to do constructive thinking."
- "6. To develop student abilities in finding and evaluating information, forming judgments, etc."
- "7. To develop student abilities in leadership, initiative, and aggressiveness."
- "9. To develop student abilities which will enable him not only to make a living but know how to live."
- "A carefully worked out agricultural curriculum is essential if students are to receive the full benefit of a cultural and vocational education."

Agricultural education pathways and curriculum frameworks will be rolled out in January. This process is an excellent opportunity for Purdue, Vincennes, Ivy Tech and high school agricultural education programs to look at curriculum, find dual credit opportunities and find plans of study for students from freshman in high school to the workforce. A couple new courses are in the works, as well as some course renaming and curriculum work. It is an exciting time. I personally would like to thank Lisa and Anna for all their work on curriculum and the pathway group that is made up of secondary and postsecondary teachers as well as business leaders and CTE directors.

Butcher Fellowship for Agricultural Education

Dale R. Butcher was agricultural science and business teacher in the Benton Community Schools for nearly 40 years. During that time he received numerous distinctions including Benton Community Teacher of the Year, president of Indiana Vocational Agriculture Teachers Association (twice), president of National Vocational Agriculture Teachers Association, Purdue University College of Agriculture Distinguished Agricultural Alumni, Purdue Agricultural Alumni Association Certificate of Distinction and member of several state and national boards. Mr. Butcher was the first executive director for the Indiana Association of Agricultural Educators. For Purdue University Agricultural Education, he served as cooperating teacher and university supervisor to numerous students.

The endowment established by Dale and Toni Butcher and friends is for Indiana Agricultural Science and Business teachers pursuing an advanced degree in Agricultural Education. By sponsoring this award the Butcher Family also honors their parents, Nelson and Ethel Butcher, both Purdue employees, who educated all five of their children at Purdue.

The Butcher Fellowship will award one fellowship of approximately \$1,000. As the endowment grows, the award can grow higher or additional fellowships can be awarded.

The process to apply is:

- 1. Obtain an application form from the YDAE graduate office or from the YDAE Graduate Website (application is available beginning approximately January 1 until the due date).
- 2. Submit the application along with the other required documents listed on the application to YDAE graduate office before June 1st of each year.

A copy of the fellowship application instructions is attached below for your convenience. Please note that if the amount of this fellowship award exceeds the amount owed in tuition and fees, you may use the excess money as you deem best.

Gary Geswein Selected for Agricultural Education Award

LAS VEGAS – Gary Geswein of Palmyra, Ind. is one of only six individuals nationwide who received the National Association of Agricultural Educators (NAAE) Lifetime Achievement Award on December 3rd at the NAAE annual convention in Las Vegas.

When looking at Geswein's long list of accomplishments, it's plain to see that agriculture and agricultural education hold a special meaning for him. After receiving his Bachelor's degree in Agricultural Education from Purdue University in 1969, he went on to be the agricultural educator at four schools throughout Indiana. At each school, he influenced students and helped them develop a strong path towards their future. During his teaching career, he advised members who were elected to National FFA Office, State FFA Office, received American and State FFA Degrees, competed in numerous state Career Development Events, and were awarded several district and state FFA Proficiency Awards. Additionally, five of his students eventually went on to become agricultural educators themselves.

Outside of the classroom, Geswein always made it a priority to stay involved with numerous professional organizations to continue learning and further the success of agricultural education. As a lifetime member of NAAE, he has served as the alternate Region IV Vice President, co-hosted and chaired the Region IV Summer Meeting, represented NAAE on the National FFA Alumni Council, and played an important role on several committees. Additionally, he served as the state president for the Indiana Association of Agricultural Educators (IAAE), where he started a state mentoring program. Geswein has also played an active role in the Indiana Association for Career and Technical Education, the National Agriculture Supervision Association, the National Young Farmer Executive Committee, and the Indiana FFA Foundation.

Each of the regional Lifetime Achievement award winners received special recognition at the NAAE convention in Las Vegas. Selected for Educator Award

LAS VEGAS – Kristen Scott, agricultural educator at Lebanon High School in Lebanon, Ind., is one of 33 individuals nationwide who received the Teachers Turn the Key Award, given December 4th at the National Association of Agricultural Educators (NAAE) annual convention in Las Vegas.

The Teachers Turn the Key Award program (TTTK) is a scholarship to allow early career agricultural educators to attend the annual NAAE convention, giving them an opportunity to become involved with their professional association on a national level. TTTK participants take part in a special programming geared toward early career agricultural educators.

Scott has been a part of the four-teacher program at Lebanon High School since 2006. She believes the foundation of a person's life is formed while in school. As a teacher, Scott strives to display passion and enthusiasm in her lessons to excite students' interest in agriculture. Her goal in the classroom is to actively engage students in the learning process so they have a meaningful educational experience.

"Kristen captivates her students and colleagues through her positive approach to teaching which allows her to get the most out of her students," said Kevin O'Rourke, principal at Lebanon High School. "Her persistency and commitment to success is a model for all flourishing teachers."
